Dear Georgia State Board Members,

In connection with a review I conducted on Georgia RESA training catalogs, it was noted that several Georgia RESAs are offering training courses to Georgia educators that may not be in compliance with the State Board of Education (SBOE) June 3, 2021 resolution. Additionally, a potential conflict of interest was identified with a current state public education employee also being hired as consultant by many Georgia school districts, and this employee/consultant may be providing race based trainings to Georgia's educators.

Included herein is a letter recently sent to Mr. Richard Woods and two Board members ,as well as exhibits identifying the concerns. At issue here is Georgia's *own* education agencies, RESAs, offering training in direct conflict with SBOE resolution and in conflict with the Georgia Department of Education--the agency which provides public funding to the RESAs.

I urge you to review this information and act immediately as noted in my letter. I am open to any questions or comments.

I look forward to hearing from you in hopes that actions will be taken to address these matters and eliminate any potential cause for state sanctioned race discrimination.

Dear Mr. Woods, Ms. Kinnemore, and Mr. Johnson,

Following up on our letter of July 18, 2021, we had respectfully requested a response regarding potential action that the Georgia State Board of Education (SBOE) and the Georgia Department of Education (GDOE) may take after learning that agencies receiving funding directly from the GDOE were not in compliance with SBOE June 3, 2021 resolution. As of today, in looking at RESA training catalogs, I was dismayed to see that non-compliant trainings were still listed for the noted RESA's.

These RESA's appear to be in direct non-compliance with your resolution but it appears no action has yet to be taken. Will the SBOE or SDOE be taking action? If not, then what is the point of the resolution?

It's my understanding that the Chairman of the State Board of Education spoke to a member of our team after the July Board meeting, and he stated the SBOE would not be putting forth a policy, rather the SBOE would wait for the Georgia legislature to take care of pushing through legislation to safeguard our children from discriminatory, biased and politically based education. Is this your position as well?

Our children have already started school.....they are/will be exposed to divisive, biased concepts, doctrine, and political activism that is not appropriate in public education of our children--and will be in conflict with SBOE resolution. What is to be done?

Parents are speaking out, but this is not working. Teachers and school boards are disregarding the voices of the parents and their constituents.

-We need the SBOE to issue a policy now.

-We need the GDOE/SBOE to oversee the RESA's and eliminate training programs that are in conflict with the SBOE resolution.

-We need the GDOE to review the use of Georgia public school systems' use of vendors who are training our teachers in matters in conflict with SBOE resolution.

-We need the GDOE to review the potential conflict of interest of a current state public school employee also being hired as a vendor to provide training and workshops to school system employees.

We urge you to take action today if it has not already been taken.

We again kindly request a response so that we may be aware of actions being taken by the GDOE and the SBOE on behalf of our children and the state of Georgia,
